

## Criminology and Criminal Justice Tenure Track Assistant Professor Position

**Oklahoma State University.** The Department of Sociology at Oklahoma State University invites applications for a tenure-track position at the Assistant Professor rank for a scholar to enhance our departmental strength in Criminology and Criminal Justice. A PhD in Sociology, Criminology or Criminal Justice is required. Candidates with a robust research agenda, publications, and potential to develop a strong record of scholarship and extramural funding are preferred. Located within the College of Arts and Sciences, the Department of Sociology is recognized nationally for its excellence in research and commitment to undergraduate and graduate education. This distinction derives from a strong grounding in theoretical inquiry, creative promotion of critical thinking, and attention to diverse intellectual perspectives. The successful candidate will play a significant role in both the graduate and undergraduate teaching programs and will have a teaching load of two courses per semester. The start date is planned for Fall 2021. Salary is competitive and negotiable. Oklahoma State University is a comprehensive research institution with an approximate enrollment of 25,000. The Department of Sociology offers Doctorate, Master's and Bachelor's degrees. Review of applications begins on February 15, 2021 and will continue until the position is filled.
