COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course examines offender reentry in the United States. Throughout the course, we will explore reentry as a process that individuals experience with a range of challenges existing prior to, during, and after incarceration. This course will also explore the historical trends in reentry policy and practice, causes of mass incarceration, profiles of inmate populations, correctional facility experiences, recidivism and risk prediction, and future reentry policy initiatives and strategies. The course will take on a more practical approach to learning about this subject by utilizing both academic and professional skills.

COURSE PREREQUISITES

CCJS100, CCJS105, and CCJS300

REQUIRED TEXTBOOKS

QUIZZES

Pop quizzes will be given throughout the semester on the assigned readings and lecture notes. Quizzes may be in the format of true/false, multiple choice, and/or short answer questions. Since these are unannounced quizzes, you will be able to use your handwritten notes on quiz days. If you arrive late to class and the quiz is currently in session, you will not receive extra time on the quiz. However, if you arrive late to class and the quiz is no longer in session or ending, you will not be able to complete the quiz and you will receive a zero. There are no makeups for quizzes except in the cases of excused absences which always require prior notice and acceptable forms of documentation excusing the absence. At the end of the semester, the lowest scoring quiz will be dropped for each student.

PARTICIPATION

Students are expected to attend class regularly, on time, and participate in all classroom activities. These activities may include classroom discussions, debates, written assignments, reflections, surveys, etc. on the assigned readings, as well as videos and other topics that emerge throughout the classroom environment. Participation will be tracked through these activities to ensure fairness in grading. In order to obtain participation credit, students must be present in class on the day the activities are assigned. If you miss class, you will not be able to make up participation credit that day unless you notified me of your excused absence prior to the start of class.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Since there is no textbook required for you to purchase in this class, each student will contribute to creating a library of sources for the class. These sources should be utilized based on their relevance to your reentry project topic. Each student will be responsible for researching an article on offender reentry and creating an executive summary on the source which will be used to facilitate discussion in the following class. Please check ELMS for the schedule so that you are aware of your assigned day. If you miss your assigned day, you will be moved to another day for a maximum of 50% on the assignment.

PROGRESS REPORTS

This class requires students to work on their reentry project throughout the semester. To ensure students are working productively, progress reports will be required from each student to track progress towards the completed project. The due dates for these reports are listed in the course schedule. Specific requirements for each progress report will be posted on ELMS. Progress reports not submitted on time will receive a zero.

REENTRY PROJECT

Students will work on creating solutions to reentry challenges for specific offending populations throughout the semester. The reentry project will be a culmination of these solutions that the student produces in a creative manner, such as the creation of an organization, website, agency, etc. <u>Students will determine the format in which their reentry project is completed</u>, with the guidance and approval of Dr. Madoo. Students will also be expected to present their reentry project ideas to the class in order to educate other students on the strategies and approaches necessary for specific offending populations to experience successful reentry outcomes. Feedback from the presentations should be incorporated into the project. Students may choose to work with another student on the project. Reentry projects will not be accepted late in the class.

The student must notify Dr. Madoo <u>prior</u> to missing a class or assignment for a makeup to be scheduled. If you know in advance that you will be absent for a class or assignment due date with an approved absence (you must notify me at least one week prior to the due date), you will be expected to take the quiz or turn in the assignment prior to the due date. All makeup assignments must be completed as soon as you return but no later than one week of the missed assignment.

Official documentation is always required. Students may, one time per course per semester, provide a self-signed excuse as documentation of a medically necessitated absence from a single class that does not coincide with a major graded assessment or assignment due date. For all other medically necessitated absences, students must provide verifiable documentation from a physician or the University Health Center, upon request of the course instructor. Dr. Madoo reserves the right to verify all documentation submitted in this class. If a student is found providing false information, a referral will be made to the Office of Student Conduct and may result in disciplinary action.

If you miss a class, it is your responsibility to obtain lecture notes from a classmate as lecture notes will not be posted online. To succeed in this course, you will need to attend classes regularly to ensure you understand the course material covered.
